JCL Day Programs bringing pride and joy

Day Programs are a vital part of our work and important programs that bring much joy, pride, and purpose to our residents. There are many different types of day programming which include individualized day programs and day programs outside of JCL at other service provider agencies.

Some residents who live in our Community Residential Supports receive day programming from our wonderful Life Skills Instructors. Our individualized day programs allows residents to do activities that they feel bring joy and value to their lives. We are fortunate that, the Jewish Community Foundation, has supported us in this endeavor. Their generosity has helped us support job coaching and training.

One of the residents who benefits from our day programming is Arsenia. Arsenia lives in an apartment and with the help of Life Skills Instructor, Samantha Rudolph, enjoys working on a weekly basis. In the Spring, Summer, and Fall Arsenia volunteers at a Levo which is a local hydroponic farm that sells vegetables to its local customers. Arsenia's paid job is to assist with jobs in the office. Each day of the week, Arsenia can be seen at the JCL office shredding papers, collecting recycling, delivering mail, as well as delivering coffee and tea orders.

Receiving a pay check is a source of pride for Arsenia. When asked about work, she exclaimed "I like it!". She is able to go out and purchase things that she wants, her paycheck gives her freedom to do that.

Sam says, "Working with Arsenia has it challenges but she has come a long way already. I am proud of her and seeing her progress feel very rewarding."

Matt is another resident who lives in his own apartment and works at the JCL office. Once a week, Matt, along with Life Skills Instructor Jasmine Thompson, comes in to clean each of the seven offices in the two suites JCL occupies along with the kitchen and common areas. Matt is responsible for vacuuming, wiping down surfaces, and emptying garbage bins.

Matt says, "I like to make make. I live to out to eat to Max Burger, Friendly's, and A.C. Peterson's."

"I'm happy he is able to work. It's a pleasure to be able to help Matt!", says Jasmine.

For many of us work can be a means to an end, we depend on our paycheck to pay bills, buy groceries, etc. Paid work for Arsenia and Matt equates to independence in a life that they depend on so many others for help.
